GENERAL REGULATIONS

The Cranleigh and South Eastern Agricultural Society has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present at the Show. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid or prevent accidents occurring and must act upon the instructions of officials and stewards.

Exhibitors must comply with the current DEFRA rules and regulations on Animal Gatherings and Movements in force at the time of the show. Full details are available on the DEFRA web site or local Animal Health Office. Cattle exhibitors must also comply with current BCMS requirements. Sheep and goat exhibitors must also comply with current SGHS requirements. BIOSECURITY - all livestock vehicles must arrive having been cleaned and disinfected before leaving home. Special attention should be given to vehicle wheel arches and footwells. Please ensure that before leaving the showground vehicles are clean, that footwear is clean and disinfected and that all contaminated clothing is changed (or safely disposed of if disposable). Please remember to "be seen to be clean".

SHOWGROUND HOLDING NUMBER 40/067/8000

1. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW, other than as stated in the Schedule.
2. Any animal shown must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
3. All animals must be free of Disease
4. All livestock shall be attended to by some persons on behalf of the exhibitor to give such information as the Judge or Steward may require and in default of such attendance, the exhibitor shall be rendered ineligible to receive the prize which might otherwise have been awarded. No stock shall be marked until after the decision of the Judges. All exhibitors must send proper and adequate food and bedding for the animals. All stockmen and attendants must conform to the directions of the Stewards.
5. Cattle, sheep and pigs will be provided with covered accommodation but straw will not be provided.
6. Exhibitors should reserve sufficient stalls or pens for the number of animals they intend to bring to the Show.
7. In the event of any competitor withdrawing his entry fees will not be returned.
8. Entry fees will be refunded in the event of the cancellation of cattle, sheep, pig or goat classes due to an outbreak of any restrictive disease.
9. Stock may arrive at the Showground during the afternoon prior to Show Day or not later than 8.00am on the day. All stock vehicles must be off the Showground and either parked in the cattle lorry area or have left the site by 8.30am.
10. NO ANIMALS COMPETING FOR PRIZES OFFERED SHALL BE REMOVED UNTIL AFTER THE MAIN LIVESTOCK PARADE IN WHICH ALL PRIZE WINNING ANIMALS MUST TAKE PART. IN THE INTERESTS OF SAFETY, NO STOCK VEHICLES WILL BE PERMITTED ON THE SHOWGROUND UNTIL ALL ANIMALS HAVE BEEN RETURNED TO STALLS, AFTER THE PARADE.
11. JUDGES - the Society reserves the right to substitute Judges for those named or to make additional appointments. A judge's decision shall be final.
12. Any competitor intending to object to any exhibit must notify the same in writing to the Secretary before the Grand Cattle Parade has commenced on the day of the Show and at the same time leave a deposit of £10.00, which will be returned if the objection is sustained. However, if, in the opinion of the objections committee, the objection is unreasonable, the deposit is forfeited.
13. Classes will be cancelled or amalgamated if there are not sufficient entries. In the event of any class being cancelled, the entry fees will be returned.
14. All dogs must be on leads at all times.
15. Neither the Society, nor any of its officers or servants, shall be in any way responsible or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatever) to exhibitors or their servants or agents, or to any exhibit, or any vehicle conveying any exhibit, or any crate, package, show case or other article or thing containing or relating to any exhibit, or any other property brought on to the Showground, or for anything else in connection with, or arising out of, or attributable to, the Society's Show.

EACH EXHIBITOR SHALL BE SOLELY RESPONSIBLE for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by, or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him, and for its description as given in the catalogue, and shall indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. Exhibitors shall be responsible for the behaviour of the servants or agents and for the consequences of any misconduct of such servants or agents. Exhibitors should be satisfied in all cases that the correct and appropriate restraining method and equipment is provided for use by animal handlers. Exhibitors must ensure that all stock handlers are adequately trained.

16. VETERINARY EMERGENCY TREATMENT - it is a condition of entry that the Society's Veterinary Officers may on their own authority give to any animals such emergency treatment as they may consider appropriate in the event that the owner or his representative cannot immediately be found.

17. In the event of any animal dying or being destroyed on the Showground, the owner/exhibitor is responsible for the cost of disposal and agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of that cost.

CATTLE REGULATIONS

SHOWGROUND HOLDING NUMBER 40/067/8000

The Society offers an award to each cattle exhibitor of £10.00 for every adult animal that is entered and put forward on the day. These awards will be sent after the show. There will also be a 50% refund on all filled stalls.

1. Passports **MUST ACCOMPANY** ALL animals.

Legal requirements for the movement of Animals/Cattle Passports

Exhibitors are reminded to ensure they, or their haulier, can provide upon request, completed Animal Transport Certificates, for the journey(s) to the Showground. Owners of Cattle must ensure that the animals are accompanied by, and can provide upon request, the relevant Full Cattle Passport or Certificate of Registration, or for animals under 28 days old a Calf Passport Application (CPP12), duly completed. Guidance on the necessary completion of cattle passports to/from Showgrounds can be obtained from the BCMS Helpline, tel. 0845 050 1234. Owners of all stock are reminded that the relevant records of the animal(s) movements to the Show must be duly entered into their On Farm Register or movement book within 36 hours. Also the movement cards in Full Cattle Passports and Certificates of Registration should be completed and sent to BCMS within 3 days. The movement summary in Full Cattle Passports should also be completed. Cranleigh Show bar coded labels are available from the Secretary and will be sent with your exhibitor number.

2. Cattle must originate from premises that are not under DEFRA restrictions for tuberculosis or brucellosis. They must have been bona fide property of the exhibitor on his holding for at least two calendar months prior to the show.
3. Animals which calve, or show evidence of calving, whilst at the showground must be placed in the approved isolation accommodation pending their possible early removal from the showground.
4. Where an animal calves at full term and the owner arranges for a blood sample and a vaginal swab to be taken and examined at an approved laboratory, and the Rose Bengal Plate Test (RBPT) and microscopical examination of a smear made from the vaginal swab are negative, the animal may return to the show lines at the discretion of the Show Secretary.
5. Where an animal calves prematurely, or aborts, the Show DVM must be informed immediately. The animal must be placed in isolation in the approved accommodation, and the full range of samples (including if at all possible a placental smear) should be taken. The animal will not be allowed to take further part in the show and once it is fit to travel, can be returned home to the registered premises or alternatively retained until the end of the show in isolation and returned with the other competing cattle from the same premises.
6. All other bovine animals from the same registered premises will not be allowed to compete further in the Show until negative results from certain tests carried out by a Veterinary Investigation Centre (RBPT and microscopical examination of a vaginal smear from the aborted animal) have been received. They can be returned with the suspect animal at the completion of the Show.
7. Exhibitors will be sent appropriate cards, which should be completed and displayed above the animals. Substitute entry cards will be available from the Secretary or Stewards. These must be completed and returned to the Secretary's office before judging commences.

8. Cattle may automatically transfer from In-calf to In-milk classes and vice versa.
9. All cattle must be tied up at their allotted places and exhibitors shall provide their own show halters.
10. Sealing or taping of teats is not permitted.
11. All cattle must be led and paraded in the ring for judging.
12. Exhibitors shall comply with the Guidance Note GS36 on the safe custody and handling of bulls at Agricultural Shows issued by the Health and Safety Executive, June 1986.
13. In the interests of competition, substitution of animals in the Cattle Section will be allowed up to 8.00am on Show day, provided the animal is eligible for the class requirements. This need not be the class originally entered. Substitute forms will be available from the Stewards or the Secretary's office from 2.00pm Saturday.
14. All cattle to be shown under their Breed Society Rules.
15. Would competitors please note that there will be no milking facilities available at the show.

SHEEP REGULATIONS

1. There will be separate accommodation for Sheep Health Scheme accredited flocks and non-scheme flocks.
2. All sheep from the SAC 'MV/CAE Accredited' Flocks must be accompanied by a VALID Accreditation Certificate (Green SAC Veterinary Certificate). **PHOTOCOPY TO ACCOMPANY ENTRY FORM.** Original MUST be produced on the day of the show before any animal will be allowed to unload. (note expiry date)
3. In order to comply with the conditions of approval for the showing of scrapie monitored sheep, exhibitors must declare on the entry form their acceptance of the rules, which are: that all females of all breeds except Dorset Horn, Polled Dorset and Finnish Landrace are
 - (a) non-pregnant (empty)
 - (b) have not lambed within 30 days prior to the show
 - (c) not subject to procedures which change the seasonal breeding pattern. All females of the Dorset Horn, Polled Dorset and Finnish Landrace breeds, and animals subject to procedures which change the seasonal breeding pattern must be accompanied by a signed declaration for each animal from flock masters or their agents which states that the animals listed on the entry form are
 - (a) non pregnant (empty)
 - (b) have not lambed in the previous 30 days.
4. All sheep to be shown according to their Breed Society Rules.
5. All pedigree sheep to be shown in halters and only non-accredited Champions to take part in the Livestock Parade.
6. Unless otherwise specified, all lambs to be under 12 months old on day of show.

PIG REGULATIONS

1. All exhibitors are required to complete a declaration for a Schedule IV Movement Licence, which must accompany the pigs to the Showground.
2. Pedigree sheets must be available for inspection.
3. Classes will be amalgamated if entries are insufficient.
4. Pigs to have been registered in a published volume or accepted for entry in a forthcoming volume of the British Pig Association' Herd Book or British Lop Pig Society's Herd Book. (It is not sufficient for an animal to be "eligible for registration"). Animals registered in a Grading Register of a Herd Book are not eligible for entry in Agricultural Show classes.
5. The ear number, registered name, Herd Book number and date of birth of each pig, also the name and Herd book number of sire and dam, must be supplied for printing in the catalogue together with the name of the breeder in cases where the exhibitor is not also the breeder.
6. At all Shows in 2009, female pigs (all breeds) born before 1st January 2008 shall be eligible to compete only if in the six calendar months prior to the Show or on or after 1st January 2009 they have farrowed, suckled and reared to three weeks of age, a litter of pigs.
7. Female pigs born on or after 1st January 2008 and before 1st July 2008 (BERKSHIRE, GLOUCESTERSHIRE OLD SPOTS, HAMPSHIRE, LANDRACE, LARGE WHITE AND MIDDLE WHITE breeds ONLY), shall have either produced and reared a litter of pigs within six months prior to the show or produced a LIVE litter within twelve weeks of the day of the Show.

8. Female pigs of the BRITISH SADDLE BACK, DUROC, and LARGE BLACK breeds born on or after 1st January 2008 and before 1st March 2008 shall have farrowed and suckled a litter of pigs prior to the Show. Females born on or after 1st March 2007 and before 1st July 2007 shall farrow within twelve weeks of the day of the Show.
9. Female pigs of the TAMWORTH breed only born on or after 1st January 2008 and before 1st July 2008 shall either have farrowed, suckled and reared a litter prior to the Show or produce a live litter within six weeks of the first day of the Show.
10. Female pigs of the WELSH breed born on or after 1st January 2008 and before 1st March 2008 shall have farrowed and suckled a litter of pigs prior to the Show. Females born on or after 1st March and before 1st July 2008 shall farrow before, or within eight weeks after the day of the Show.
11. The use of artificial colouring, whitening and/or powder on pigs as well as the removal or addition of spots by artificial means is prohibited (white woodflour is permitted).

GOAT REGULATIONS AND CLASSIFICATION

1. Entries will be restricted to goats from herds that are whole herd negative CAE tested within the twelve months prior to the show. This category may include goats eligible for category B, (3m gap rule applies). No entries will be accepted in the B or W categories unless CAE blood test results are on BGS submission forms. This is to enable quick and accurate confirmation of the status of the goats attending the show. Photocopy to accompany entry form.
2. In order to comply with the conditions for the showing of scrapie monitored goats, owners must declare on the entry form that each animal entered is
 - (a) non pregnant (empty)
 - (b) has not kidded in the previous 30 days.
3. All exhibits must be on the Showground by 8.00am on the day of the Show, except goats that have kidded who must be on the Showground by 5.00pm on the day before the Show. No goat may leave the Showground before 4.30pm on the day of the show.
4. The registered number of any goat, initially as R.A.F. (registration applied for), must be submitted to the Show Secretary before that goat competes.
5. Goats may be of any age and must have borne a kid not less than 30 days before the day of the Show and be in milk.
6. Accommodation will not be covered and bedding is not provided.
7. No late or incorrect entries will be accepted.
8. Substitutions will not be accepted.
9. Entries will be acknowledged upon receipt of a stamped addressed envelope.

CAMELID REGULATIONS

1. All exhibits must be shown in accordance with British Camelid Association rules and conditions.
2. All exhibitors must comply with animal health and transportation regulations as laid down by DEFRA.
3. All exhibitors must have sufficient insurance cover.

DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

EVERY PERSON WHILST ON THE SHOWGROUND BEFORE, DURING OR AFTER THE SHOW SHALL DEEM TO BE THERE AT HIS OR HER OWN RISK AND NO PERSON SHALL MAKE OR HAVE ANY CLAIM AGAINST THE CRANLEIGH AND SOUTH EASTERN AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY, ITS MEMBERS, OFFICERS, CLERKS OR SERVANTS IN RESPECT OF ANY ACCIDENT OR INJURY HE OR SHE MAY SUSTAIN, OR LOSS OR PROPERTY OF ANY PERSON ATTENDING THE SHOW.

THE CORONATION PERPETUAL CHALLENGE TROPHY presented by Mr and Mrs D Berdoe-Wilkinson to the Exhibitor gaining the greatest number of points in the Livestock Classes at the Show (excluding herd competitions on the farm).

THE NUTTING PERPETUAL CHALLENGE CUP presented by Captain A R S Nutting to the Exhibitor gaining the greatest number of points in the on-farm and harvested crop Inspection Classes during the year.

THE FLUX TROPHY for the Best Trade Stand with a frontage of under 10 metres.

THE HAMBLEDON TROPHY for the Best Trade Stand with a frontage of 10 metres and over.

The Robert Lusher Perpetual Memorial Rosebowl presented by Mrs R Lusher will be awarded to the winner.

Points taken into consideration will be:

- a) Standard of commercial farming (30 points)
- b) Degree to which uncropped areas are managed to the advantage of wildlife, such as hedges, ditches, field corners, stockyards, ponds, woodland, etc. (25 points)
- c) Overall assessment of the degree to which the farm's potential for wildlife conservation has been developed within the context of its farming system (30 points)
- d) Extent to which chemical, pest and weed control has been balanced to obtain the maximum crop advantage with minimum damage to wildlife (10 points)

General Conditions:

1. A draw for ploughing positions will take place and the order in which such positions are drawn will be printed in the programme issued at the Match.
2. Rolling not allowed
3. Twin tractor wheels are not allowed, nor any change of wheels.
4. Three siting poles only, assistance to set and remove is permitted
5. Handling, treading or shaping of furrows is not allowed.
6. Ploughs must be fitted with skimmers, tailpieces are permitted
7. Plough bodies are to be in the 'Ploughing' position at all times, all plough bodies must be used when finishing.
8. All competitors must plough single handed.
9. The CSEAS have the power to cancel or amalgamate classes, if in their opinion there are insufficient entries.

TRACTORS

Timing:

1. All tractors to be on the ground by 8.00am.
2. Veerings to be opened from 8.30am.
3. Ploughing will commence at 9.15am.
4. Three hours will be allowed to plough the plot. Fifteen minutes extra time will be allowed for any cast off necessary.
5. At finishing time the run can be completed without stopping.

Opening:

Conventional Ploughing - Double Split no ground to be left unturned
Reversible Ploughing - Single furrow opening with right hand bodies.

Start:

Conventional Ploughing - Start to consist of 11 or 12 furrows
Reversible Ploughing - Start to consist of 8, 9 or 10 furrows towards lower number.

Ploughing:

Conventional Ploughing - Cast to next highest number
Reversible Ploughing - Plough from next highest number back to own start. Alternate bodies to be used at all times.

Finish:

Only one wheel mark to be visible, penalty 20 pts.

Conventional - Last furrow to be cast to own start, penalty 20 pts. Finish to consider of last 12 furrows.

Reversible - Finish to consist of last 15 - 16 furrows.

Depth:

Competitors will be notified. Depth must be reached on completion of the start and adhered to until commencing the finish.

Failure to plough specified depth results in 20 penalty pts per ½ inch above specification.
